	Though the matter has appeared under the	
	heading "Reply/Rejoinder and Objection", by consent of	
	Mrs. Agarwal, learned advocate for the applicant and Mr.	
	R.A. Chowdhury, learned advocate for the State	
	Respondent, the matter is taken up for hearing.	
	In this application, the applicants who were	
	working as labourers in Nursery and Plantation	
	maintenance under the Divisional Forest Officer,	
	Durgapur, Burdwan Division have challenged the order	
	dated 28 th March, 2017 passed by the Divisional Forest	
	Officer, Burdwan Division, the Respondent No. 3 on	
	various grounds, which was passed pursuant to the	
	direction of the Tribunal in OA 476 of 2016 on 16 th	
	February, 2017 after giving an opportunity of hearing. It	
	is submitted by Mrs. S. Agarwal that as the applicants	
	were engaged in different types of plantation from 1993	
	to July, 2015 and they have worked continuously for ten	
	years with at least 240 days attendance in each year ,	
	appropriate direction may be issued upon the	

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	Respondents to give them regular appointment under the	
	State of West Bengal. On a query, it is submitted that the	
	applicants who are labourers had worked not against	
	any sanctioned post. Submission is since the applicants	
	belong to the lower strata of society, their case may be	
	directed to be considered sympathetically.	
	Mr. R.A. Chowdhury, learned advocate for the	
	State Respondents submits that since the applicants were	
	engaged as labourers on casual basis for seasonal works	
	such as nursery and plantation maintenance and as there	
	are no sanctioned posts, the applicants may not be	
	directed to be appointed.	
	Heard learned advocate for the parties.	
	In our view, it cannot be denied that the	
	applicants were engaged as labourers for nursery and	
	plantation management works which are seasonal in	
	nature. It is also evident from an intimation appearing at	
	page 30 of the application, issued by the Range Officer,	
	Durgapur Forest Range , the Respondent No. 5 to the	
	Respondent no. 3 that the applicants were working on a	
	seasonal basis throughout the year and a list of labourers	
	was being sent to the Respondent no. 3 for necessary

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	action and guidance.	
	In our view, as there are no regular posts in the	
	labour category, no order can be passed on the	
	application. However, considering the facts and	
	circumstances of the case, this Original Application is	
	disposed of by directing the Divisional Forest Officer,	
	Durgapur, Burdwan Division, the Respondent No. 3 to	
	consider sympathetically for engaging the applicants as	
	seasonal labourers as and when demand arises.
