Banerjee, Advocate.</p> <p>In the application, the applicant, who had applied for a Group D post in the Irrigation and Waterways Department under the Government of West Bengal, has challenged the order dated 14<sup>th</sup> February, 2019 passed by the Secretary to the Government of West Bengal which was communicated under the letter dated 11<sup>th</sup> March, 2019 which was passed pursuant to the order dated 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2018 in O.A. 250 of 2018 (Sri Ashoke Kumar Roy –Versus- The State of West Bengal and others).</p> <p>Mr. A. Perusing the reasoned order appearing at pages 22 to 25 of the original application, particularly the "observation", we find that no effective ground has been taken challenging the findings. The applicant had submitted an affidavit before the learned 1<sup>st</sup> class Judicial Magistrate, 2<sup>nd</sup> Court, Diamond Harbour on 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2015 in which he had stated that he made a false declaration with regard to his educational qualification.
