	since missing. The mother of Suresh Singh, Premjyoti	5	
	Kumari predeceased Suresh Singh.		
	The grievance of the applicants is that the		
	respondent no. 3 did not process the case of the deceased		
	Suresh Singh for releasing retirement benefits to his legal		
	heirs on the ground that the succession certificate was		
	not produced. The succession certificate collected by the		
	applicants from the court of Subordinate Judge, Saran in		
	Bihar was produced before the Respondent No. 3 for		
	release of pensionary benefits of Late Suresh Singh in		
	favour of the applicants, who happen to be the son and		
	daughter of the deceased Suresh Singh. On perusal of the		
	letter dated August 20, 2014 issued by the Respondent		
	No. 3 in favour of applicant no. 1, we find that the		
	respondent no. 3 did not act upon succession certificate		
	issued by the Learned Subordinate Judge on the ground		
	that there is no valid proof about missing of the mother		
	of the applicants.		
	Mr. Karim, Learned Counsel representing the		
	applicants submits that the Learned Subordinate Judge of		
	Bihar, who issued succession certificate in favour of the		
	applicants has categorically observed in the order about		
	the fact of missing of the mother of the applicants. Mr.

	Banerjee, Learned Counsel representing the State		
	Respondents submits that the Respondent No. 3 may be		
	in trouble if the mother of the applicants is found alive		
	and if the mother of the applicants claim her share of		
	retirement benefits in future. Since the mother of the		
	applicants was not traceable since June 15, 2001 inspite		
	of reporting the fact of her missing to the police and		
	since this fact has been dealt with in detail by Learned		
	Subordinate Judge, who issued the succession certificate		
	in favour of the applicant No 1, we are of the view that		
	the respondent no. 3 was not justified in ignoring the		
	succession certificate issued in favour of the applicant		
	No 1 by the competent court of law. The applicants have		
	been deprived of the retirement benefits of their father		
	for about ten years. This delay of ten years cannot be		
	attributed solely on the conduct of the respondent no. 3.		
	However, the respondent no. 3 was not justified in		
	refusing to act upon the succession certificate issued by		
	the competent court of law by issuing letter dated August		
	23, 2014 in favour of the applicant No. 1 . So the		
	respondent No. 3 should pay interest on the retirement		
	benefits of the deceased Suresh Singh at the rate of 6.5		
	per cent per annum .

	retirement benefits of the deceased Suresh Singh in		
	favour of the applicants.
