	In this application the applicant, who is at	
	present posted as Senior Lecturer in DIET, 24-Parganas	
	(South), has challenged the order of transfer dated 11 <sup>th</sup>	
	July, 2017 transferring him to DIET, Uttar Dinajpur , 2 <sup>nd</sup>	
	Campus as Senior Lecturer in Charge.	
	It is submitted by Mr. Hati, learned advocate	
	for the applicant that the order of transfer is bad and	
	arbitrary as he was transferred to the present place of	
	posting on 26 <sup>th</sup> August, 2016. It is further submitted that	
	since persons similarly situated are continuing in their	
	posts, as evident from the rejoinder to the report filed by	
	the State Council of Education and Training, Government	
	of West Bengal, therefore, the order of transfer is bad in	
	law. Since he has to look after his father, who is now 85	
	years of age, son and daughter are studying and there are	
	female members in the family, the authorities should

	consider his case sympathetically. In this connection, the	
	learned Advocate for the applicant has relied on the	
	judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in B.	
	Varadha Rao – Vs- State of Karnataka and Ors reported in	
	AIR 1986 SC 1955 in support of his contention.	
	Moreover, it is submitted that he is prepared	
	to join the transferred place at Uttar Dinajpur within six	
	months. Prayer has also been made for consideration of	
	the representation dated 12 <sup>th</sup> July, 2017 against the	
	impugned order of transfer.	
	Learned advocate appearing on behalf of the	
	State Respondents relying on the report prepared by the

	one Primary Teacher Training Institute at Alipurduar, set	
	up under backward region Grant Fund, has been	
	designated as District Institute of Education and Training.	
	The Department has issued instruction to operationalise	
	the said second campuses. Relying on the report, it is	
	submitted that in order to operationalise the second	
	campuses personnel are needed to be transferred from	
	the existing pool of faculty members in the 16 District	
	Institute of Education and Training of West Bengal- DIETs-	
	of West Bengal and accordingly a detailed plan has been	
	worked out and the order of transfer dated 11 <sup>th</sup> July,	
	2017 is for implementation of the said scheme. In this	
	regard reference has been made to paragraph 1d of the	
	report to demonstrate the fact that persons similarly	
	situated have also been transferred from their present	
	place of posting.	
	Heard learned advocates for the parties.	
	Evidently the petitioner has challenged the	
	order of transfer transferring him from the present place

	In our view, transfer is an incident of service	
	and the petitioner cannot deny the same. The petitioner	
	in his rejoinder has not able to controvert the statements	
	made in paragraph 1a to 1d of the report of the events	
	leading to transfer. The applicant has not been able to	
	demonstrate that the order of transfer was in violation of	
	any statutory rule. The principles of law laid down in B.	
	Varadha Rao(supra) are not applicable as therein the	
	order of transfer was against the conditions of service.	
	Rather in the said judgement it has been held that "It is	
	an accepted principle that in public service transfer is an	
	incident of service. It is also an implied condition of	
	service and appointing authority has a wide discretion in	
	the matter. The Government is the best judge to decide	
	how to distribute and utilise the services of its employees.	
	However, this power must be exercised honestly, bona	
	fide and reasonably. It should be exercised in public	
	interest. If the exercise of power is based on extraneous	
	considerations or for achieving an alien purpose or an	
	oblique motive it would amount to mala fide and	
	colourable exercise of power. Frequent transfer, without	
	sufficient reasons to justify such; transfer, cannot, but be

	held as mala fide. A transfer is mala fide when it is made	
	not for professed purpose, such as in normal course or in	
	public or administrative interest or in the exigencies of	
	service but for other purpose, than is to accommodate	
	another person for undisclosed reasons. It is the basic	
	principle of rule of law and good administration, that	
	even administrative action should be just and fair".	
	In the instant case, the petitioner, who is a	
	Senior Lecturer of DIET, 24-Parganas (South) as Senior	
	Lecturer has been directed to be transferred along with	
	others to operationalise the second campuses. It is to be	
	noted that the petitioner has been unable to	
	demonstrate that the order of transfer is in violation of	
	Statutory Rules. Therefore, the order of transfer cannot	
	be interfered with. Thus, the order of transfer dated $11^{th}$	
	July, 2017 does not call for interference. Hence, the	
	application is disposed of. Interim order passed on $20^{th}$	
	July, 2017 is vacated.	
	After the judgement is pronounced, Mr. A.	
	Hati, submits that the authorities may be directed to	
	consider the representation dated 12 <sup>th</sup> July, 2017	
	appearing at page 39 of the application addressed to the
