	Affidavit of Service filed on behalf of the applicant today is kept on record.	
	The applicant has prayed for direction upon the respondents to disburse arrears of salary of the	
	applicant after giving him benefit of second Career Advancement Scheme and after setting aside the impugned order dated August 02, 2017 issued by the Sub-Divisional Officer, Bishnupur, Bankura.	
	The applicant joined in the service as Assistant Public Prosecutor in the court of Judicial Magistrate at Berhampore in the district of Murshidabad on April 12, 1993. While the applicant was attached to the court of	
	Learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bishnupur, he did not sign on the Attendance Register kept in the office of the Sub-Divisional Officer,	
	Bishnupur. The applicant was directed repeatedly by the Sub-Divisional Officer, Bishnupur and ultimately by the District Magistrate, Bankura to put signature on the	
	Attendance Register, but the applicant was not in a position to sign on the Attendance Register during the period from April 21, 2014 to September 09, 2015.	
	During the aforesaid period, the order was issued by the	

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	Deputy Secretary to the Government of West Bengal,	
	Judicial Department on January 30, 2015 for granting	
	second benefit of Career Advancement Scheme to the	
	applicant, but he did not get the actual financial benefit	
	of Career Advancement Scheme due to not signing on	
	the Attendance Register in the office of Sub-Divisional	
	Officer, Bishnupur. Ultimately, on July 26, 2017, the	
	applicant was transferred from the post of Assistant	
	Public Prosecutor, Bishnupur to the post of Assistant	
	Public Prosecutor, Durgapur by way of attachment to	
	the court of Learned Judicial Magistrate at Durgapur.	
	The respondent no. 3, Sub-Divisional Officer, Bishnupur	
	ultimately issued an order on August 02, 2017 by	
	treating the absence of the applicant for a period of 507	
	days i.e. from April 21, 2014 to September 09, 2015 as	
	unauthorised by making observation about	
	insubordination and deduction of leave from the leave	
	account of the applicant. The applicant has challenged	
	the said impugned order dated August 02, 2017 as	
	arbitrary and without jurisdiction and prayed for setting	
	aside the said order.	
	Having heard Learned Counsel representing both	
	parties and on consideration of the materials on record,	

we find that the applicant did not sign on the

Attendance Register in the office of the Sub-Divisional

Officer, Bishnupur during the period from April 21, 2014

to September 09, 2015 though it is contended by the

applicant that he discharged his official duty

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Assistant Public Prosecutor before the court of Learned				
Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bishnupur and				
other courts of Judicial Magistrate at Bishnupur.				
Admittedly, the applicant retired from service on				
November 30, 2019. The further admitted position is				
that the applicant is not entitled to receive actual				
financial benefit of second Career Advancement Scheme,				
inspite of issuance of specific order in this regard by the				
Deputy Secretary to the Government of West Bengal,				
Judicial Department on January 30, 2015 without				
regularisation of the period from April 21, 2014 to				
September 09, 2015 which has been treated as				
unauthorised by the Sub-Divisional Officer, Bishnupur.				
The applicant will have to face difficulty and				
inconvenience in getting pension and other retirement				
benefits including Leave Encashment, if any unless and				
until the alleged unauthorised absence is regularised by				
passing specific order by the Departmental Secretary.				

Under the above circumstances, we would like to give the applicant an opportunity to ventilate his grievances against the impugned order dated August 02, 2017 before the respondent no. 1 by submitting a representation within a period of 04 (four) weeks. The respondent no. 1, Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Judicial Department has the authority to decide on the issue of regularisation of absence of the applicant, which is treated as unauthorised by the Sub-Divisional Officer, Bishnupur during the period from

In view of our above observations, the applicant is at liberty to file a representation before the respondent no. 1, Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Judicial Department ventilating his grievances against the impugned order dated August 02, 2017 issued by the Sub-Divisional Officer, Bishnupur within a period of 04 (four) weeks from this date. The respondent no. 1, Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Judicial Department is directed to consider the representation of the applicant (if filed within the stipulated period of time by the applicant) in accordance with law and on verification of office record after giving the applicant an opportunity of hearing by passing a reasoned order within a period of 08 (eight) weeks from the date of receiving the representation from the applicant and take necessary follow-up action within a period of 04 (four) weeks thereafter.

With the above direction the original application stands **disposed of.**
