	the result of the selection process was not displayed	
	properly and system of awarding marks was not in order.	
	Perusing paragraph 10 of the reply, we find that the	
	results were published in the website of the Police as well	
	as of the Excise Department. From paragraph 12 of the	
	said reply we find that the applicants Upen Mondal,	
	under Scheduled caste category, Srimanta Das and Souvik	
	Ghatak, both under General (Unreserved) category, had	
	obtained 66.5,68.625 and 64.25 marks respectively,	
	whereas the last selected candidate in the scheduled	
	caste category had obtained 67.38 marks and in the	
	General (Unreserved) category had obtained 69.75	
	marks. Therefore, it appears that the applicants had	
	secured lesser marks in their respective categories	
	compared to the last selected candidate and thus they	
	were not selected, which is not disputed in the rejoinder.	
	Hence, no order is passed on the application. The	
	application is disposed of.
