	The members of the family of the deceased	
	employee, who are entitled to get family pension are	
	enumerated in the provisions of Rule 7 (e) (2) of the West	
	Bengal Services (Death-cum-Retirement Benefits) Rules	
	1971 (in short, D.C.R.B. Rules) 1971. The wife of a	
	deceased Government employee is entitled to get family	
	pension under the provisions of Rule 105 of D.C.R.B.	
	Rules, 1971, but the wife must be legally married wife	
	under the provisions of personal law by which the	
	parties are governed. In the instance case, the marriage	
	between the applicant and the deceased Government	
	employee Nagendra Nath Maity is void and as such the	
	applicant has no status as legally married wife, who is	
	entitled to get family pension under the provisions of	
	D.C.R.B. Rules, 1971. In view of our above findings, the	
	original application is dismissed.
