order do issue b) directing the authorities all respondent to transmit relevant records and papers pertaining to the selection of your applicant to the post of Sub Inspector of Police under the respondent authorities for the year 2018 that conscionable justice be delivered".

Mr.S.Ghosh, learned advocate for the applicant submits that since the applicant has been successful in all the four stages in the Preliminary Examination, Physical Measurement Test, Physical Efficiency Test and in the Final Combined Competitive Examination and as in the Armed Branch (Male) under unreserved category, the cut off marks has been 105.6 marks and the applicant scored total marks 112.6 he is entitled to be appointed in the unreserved category. On a query, referring to Annexure-B to the applicant was in the Armed Branch category and Unarmed Branch category was the second preference.

Mr.G.P.Banerjee, learned advocate for the State respondent submits on instruction that there is no

	dispute that the petitioner had applied in the Armed	
	Branch as well as in the Unarmed Branch category and	
	secured 112.60 marks. In the Unarmed Branch category	
	the last selected candidate secured 118 marks. In the	
	Armed Branch category though the applicant had	
	secured 112.60 marks and the last selected candidate	
	had secured 105.6 marks, the applicant could not	
	qualify as in the chest expansion the applicant could	
	expand up to 84 cm whereas the minimum bench	
	mark was 86 cm. Let a copy of the written instruction	
	filed by Mr. Banerjee be kept on record and a copy of	
	the same be served on Mr. Ghosh, which is served and	
	accepted.	
	Since we find that the applicant could not	
	succeed in the examination of Unarmed Branch	
	category as he secured less marks and in the Armed	
	Branch category he could not fulfil the minimum	
	bench mark in the chest expansion measurement, no	
	order is passed on this application. The application is	
	disposed of.
