	visually challenged, have pr	ayed for a direction upon the	
	respondents, particularly or	n the authorities of the State	
	of West Bengal to conside	r their applications for being	
	appointed as Sub-Inspectors	in the Subordinate Food and	
	Supplies Service, Grade -I	II under Food and Supplies	
	Department, Government o	f West Bengal.	
	Mr. A. Paul, lea	rned advocate appearing on	
	behalf of the applicants sub	mits that since reservation for	
	jobs has to be made for pers	sons having blindness and low	
	vision under section 34 su	b section 1 of the Rights of	
	Persons with Disabilities A	act, 2016, appropriate order	
	may be passed directing th	e respondents to allow them	
	to appear in the selection p	rocess, which is scheduled to	

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	be held on 27 th January, 2019 to be conducted by the	
	Public Service Commission, West Bengal.	
	Mr. A.L. Basu, learned advocate for the	
	Commission submits on instruction that reservation in	
	this regard could not be made for persons having	
	blindness and low vision as the concerned department	
	did not send any notice for reserving posts for persons	
	having blindness and low vision. Referring to pages 54 of	
	the Original application it is also submitted that the	
	applicants must possess sound health and ability to	
	undertake extensive tours in rural areas of West Bengal.	
	Mr. G.P. Banerjee, learned advocate appearing	
	on behalf of the State respondents submits that since the	
	applicants have blindness and low vision and as	
	appointments relate to the posts of Food Inspector, who	
	are to inspect food stuff consumed by the citizens, which	
	may not be possible by the applicants, no reservation has	
	been made for applicants having blindness and low	
	vision. In this regard, our attention has been drawn	
	second proviso to sub section (1) of Section 34 of the Act.	
	Heard Mr. Paul, Mr. Banerjee and Mr. Basu,	
	learned advocates for the parties.	

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	The Food Inspector is to carry out inspection of	
	food consumed by people which may not be possible by	
	the applicants having blindness and low vision. Moreover,	
	as seen from the advertisement appearing at page 54 to	
	56 of the application, as the applicants must have the	
	ability to undertake extensive tours in rural areas of West	
	Bengal, the respondent authorities have exempted this	
	post for being reserved for persons having disabilities	
	under 34(1)(a) of the Act. Hence no order can be passed	
	on this application. However, we trust and hope that the	
	authority shall make reservation in other branches of the	
	department in accordance with the provisions of the	
	2016 Act.	
	The application is disposed of.
