Basu, learned advocate appearing on behalf of the Public Service Commission, West Bengal referring to paragraph 4 of the reply submits that each candidate in the said selection process had to secure qualifying marks in both parts of the written examination to be eligible for the Interview. The applicant secured 10.5 marks out of 120 marks in the Part-I of the Written Examination. The qualifying marks in Part I of the written examination for the General Category was fixed 65.5 by the WBSSC. As the applicant did not secure qualifying cut-off marks in the Part-I of the Written Examination and he submitted blank answer script in Part-II of the Written Examination, he was declared disqualified and the application is without merit.</p> <p>Having heard learned advocates for the parties, since we find that the applicant failed to get required marks and was declared disqualified, no order is passed on the application.
