	as per recruitment rules. On the other hand, Learned	
	Counsel representing the state respondents submits	
	that the case of the applicant could not be considered

	service and as such the wrong entries made in the

	person who acquires eligibility for promotion either	
	from Grade III Medical Technologist to Grade II

	be considered for promotion unless vacancy arises in	
	the promotional post and the State Government

	the recruitment rules. The law is well settled that	
	promotion is not a matter of right of any government	
	employee, though consideration for promotion is a	
	matter of right of any government employee. In the	
	instant case, the applicant has miserably failed to	
	establish that there was no vacancy in the	
	promotional post which was filled up by a person who	
	is junior to the applicant in the Gradation List.	
	Naturally the applicant has failed to establish by	
	placing materials on record that the applicant has not	
	been considered for promotion when his junior was	
	considered and granted promotion either in Grade II

	applicant is not entitled to get any relief in the present	
	application.
