	The applicant has prayed for direction upon the	
	respondents for grant of higher scale of pay which was	
	allowed to his immediate junior in the promotion	
	policy laid down in G.O. dated March 12, 2009 issued	
	by the Public Works Department, Government of West	
	Bengal after setting aside the order of the Chief	
	Engineer (Headquarters), Public Works Department	
	communicated to the applicant under letter dated	
	July 17, 2014 (annexure 'D' to the original	
	application).	
	The applicant joined in the post of Assistant	
	Engineer, Public Works Department, Government of	
	West Bengal on March 31, 1983 and confirmed in the	
	service on November 18, 1997. He retired from service	
	on August 31, 2003. The contention of the applicant is	
	that 47 directly recruited Assistant Engineers got the	
	benefit of higher scale of pay from the date from which	
	their juniors got the said scale of pay in terms of G.O.	
	dated March 13, 2009 issued by the Public Works

	the applicant is that the grant of higher pay scale was	
	subsequently limited to 44 directly recruited Assistant	
	Engineers w.e.f. the date which was notified in the	
	G.O. dated March 22, 2010 issued by the Public	
	Works Department, Government of West Bengal. One	
	Sekhar Majumdar whose name appears in serial no 31	
	of the list enclosed to the G.O. dated March 22, 2010	
	got benefit of higher scale of pay notionally w.e.f. May	
	16, 1992, while actual financial benefit was given	
	w.e.f. January 09, 2004. Mr. A.L. Basu, Learned	
	Counsel for the applicant submits that Sekhar	
	Majumdar who got higher scale of pay in terms of G.O.	
	dated March 12, 2009 being clarified by G.O. dated	
	March 22, 2010 is junior to the present applicant in	
	as much as the applicant joined in the post of	
	Assistant Engineer on March 31, 1983 and Sekhar	
	Majumdar joined in the post of Assistant Engineer on	
	May 05, 1986. He further submits that the reasoned	
	order under challenge in the present application was	
	not passed by the Chief Engineer in compliance with	
	the direction given by the Tribunal on February 28,	
	2014 in OA-1358/2013. Mr. Basu has also urged this	
	Bench to consider that the reasoned order is a cryptic	
	one and as such the same is liable to be set aside.

	None appears on behalf of the state respondents,	
	though the state respondents filed one reply	
	supporting the reasoned order passed by the Chief	
	Engineer (Headquarters), Public Works Department,	
	Government of West Bengal.	
	The first issue for consideration of the Tribunal	
	is whether the applicant is entitled to get higher scale	
	of pay w.e.f. the date on which his junior Sekhar	
	Majumdar got higher scale of pay. It is relevant to	
	point out that the applicant previously approached	
	this Tribunal by filing OA-1358/2013 praying for	
	grant of higher scale of pay in terms of G.O. dated	
	March 12, 2009 issued by the Public Works	
	Department, Government of West Bengal. On	
	February 28, 2014, the Tribunal disposed of OA-	
	1358/2013 by directing Chief Engineer, Public Works	
	Department, Government of West Bengal to consider	
	whether the applicant is entitled to get higher scale of	
	pay in terms of G.O. dated March 12, 2009 within	
	stipulated period of time. On consideration of the said	
	G.O. dated March 12, 2009 (annexure 'A' to the	
	original application) we find that 47 directly recruited	
	Assistant Engineers of Public Works Department,	
	Government of West Bengal were given higher scale of

	pay w.e.f. the date on which their juniors got the said	
	scale of pay on fulfillment of the following conditions:	
	(i) the higher scale of pay must fall within the ratio of	
	60:40 of total number of Assistant Engineers of the	
	Department, (ii) the claimants must complete six years	
	of service, (iii) the claimants must pass the	
	Departmental Examination. The said financial benefit	
	was given in terms of the orders passed by the	
	Tribunal in three different original applications	
	between the period from October 11, 1996 to March	
	24, 2006.	
	However, subsequently, the number of Assistant	
	Engineers who got the said financial benefit was	
	reduced to 44 in the G.O. dated March 22, 2010,	
	though the conditions for grant of higher scale of pay	
	were not changed. No information is forthcoming	
	before us by placing Gradation List or Seniority List	
	officially published by the Public Works Department,	
	Government of West Bengal to establish that Sekhar	
	Majumdar who is alleged to be the junior of the	
	applicant was really placed below the applicant in the	
	said Gradation List or the Seniority List. Nor is there	
	any information forthcoming before us when the	
	applicant passed the departmental examination and	
	when Sekhar Majumdar passed the departmental

1	examination which is one of the conditions for grant of	3
	higher scale of pay in terms of G.O. dated March 12,	
	2009. Moreover, the alleged junior Sekhar Majumdar	
	got actual financial benefit of higher scale of pay w.e.f.	
	January 01, 2004, while he was in service, whereas	
	the applicant retired from service on August 31, 2003.	
	In view of our above observation, we cannot persuade	
	ourselves to hold that the applicant is entitled to get	
	higher scale of pay in terms of G.O. dated March 12,	
	2009 being clarified by G.O. dated March 22, 2010.	
	The next issue for our determination is whether	
	the reasoned order under challenge in the present	
	application is liable to be set aside. On perusal of the	
	reasoned order communicated under letter dated July	
	17, 2014, we find that the G.O. dated March 12, 2009	
	was issued almost after six years after retirement of	
	the applicant from service. A retired person cannot	
	claim seniority over another government employee in	
	service. Since the applicant was not in service when	
	benefit of higher scale of pay was given to his alleged	
	junior Sekhar Majumdar in terms of G.O. dated March	
	12, 2009 being clarified by G.O. dated March 22,	
	2010, the question of granting higher scale of pay to	
	the applicant in terms of G.O. dated March 12, 2009	
	was rightly turned down by the Chief Engineer, Public
