	vacancy of 1992, was initiated for direct recruitees,	
	who were appointed and joined in the year 1992.	
	Though, applicants en-block senior to the special	
	recruitees and the direct recruitees of the same	
	allotment year, as per the gradation list dated	
	07.02.2013, the name of the applicants were	
	placed against serial No.290, 283, 287 and 282	
	respectively (Annexure C). In the meantime vide	
	Memo dated 21.06.1990, the Government of West	
	Bengal decided to implement a Career
