applied for a loan of Rs. 2,30,000/- (Rupees two lakh and thirty thousand only). It also appears that he executed an agreement on 29th July, 2004, being annexure B as evident from pages 25 and 26 of the Original Application. Though the applicant had paid some instalments, he has failed to repay the loan. It is evident from the notice dated 26th July, 2018 that the dues upto 30th June, 2018, including penal interest, is Rs. 6,60,243.24. Mr. Maity, learned advocate for the applicant relying on the judgement in Nadia Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Bank Ltd. Vs. Union of India – 2013 (3) CHN (CAL) 42 submits that as in a similar matter the High Court had protected the interest of the applicant therein, appropriate order may be passed directing release of pensionary benefits which have been stopped. On a query from the Bench, learned advocate submitted that his client is unable to pay the dues as on 30th June, 2018.

Mr. G.P. Banerjee, learned advocate appearing on behalf of the respondents submits that it is evident from the judgement of Nadia Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Bank Ltd. (Supra) that superannuation benefits dues were paid to the private respondent no.6 after adjusting the amount Rs.1,16,314/- and as in the instant case, the applicant in the agreement had agreed for deduction of the amount in case of default from his salary, gratuity or any other sum
