	the respondents under any provision of the scheme for	
	giving compassionate appointment.	
	Having heard Learned Counsel representing both	
	parties, we cannot persuade ourselves to give any	
	direction to the State respondents to consider the	
	application of the applicant for compassionate	
	appointment as the said application was filed long after	
	17 years from the date of death of the father of the	
	applicant. Since the application was not filed for	
	compassionate appointment within a period of 17 years	
	from the date of death of the concerned employee, we	
	are constrained to hold that there was no acute financial	
	crisis in the family of the deceased employee for which	
	compassionate appointment should be given to any	
	member of the family of the deceased employee.	
	In view of our above findings, the original	
	application is dismissed.
