Rajib	<p>years of death of the employee cannot be entertained by the respondents under any provision of the scheme for giving compassionate appointment.</p> <p>Having heard Learned Counsel representing both parties, we cannot persuade ourselves to give any direction to the State respondents to consider the application of the applicant for compassionate appointment as the said application was filed long after 17 years from the date of death of the father of the applicant.
