	With the above factual matrix, we have to decide	
	whether the applicant is entitled to be considered for	
	giving compassionate appointment. The object of giving	
	compassionate appointment is to tide over acute	
	financial crisis caused by sudden death of the sole bread	
	winner of the family. In the instant case, the applicant	
	has submitted the application after fourteen (14) years of
