	This instant case has been come for hearing being	
	remanded back by the order of the Hon'ble High Court vide	
	order dated 24.11.2014 passed by the Hon'ble High Court in	
	WPST No. 250/2014. The instant application was initially	
	challenging the disciplinary proceedings as well as order of	
	the Governor dated 04.09.2008. He had challenged Memo	
	dated 21.11.2008 and the order of the Governor rejecting the	
	appeal of petitioner vide order dated 04.09.2008.	
	Subsequently, the applicant was charge sheeted vide Memo	
	dated 17.06.2006 (Annexure D) with an allegation of	
	unauthorised absence for the period from 04.02.1988 to	
	13.06.2005. The applicant initially participated in the	
	disciplinary proceedings and by final order dated	
	15.11.2006, he was imposed with the punishment of	
	withholding the pension permanently against which he	
	preferred an appeal before the Governor, who in turn	
	rejected his prayer on 4 th September, 2008. Being aggrieved	
	with, he has filed this instant application. In the meantime,

	01.12.2009 had regularised the leave from 01.02.1988 to	
	31.01.1993 and for the rest period from 21.01.1993 to	
	06.07.2005 was directed to be treated as dies non for all	
	purposes. The applicant wants to file supplementary	
	affidavit to bring on record the said fact. However, this	
	Tribunal vide order dated 22.08.2013 had set aside the	
	punishment order. Being aggrieved with, the State	
	Respondents have preferred one WPST No. 250/2014.	
	Hon'ble High Court after hearing both the parties passed the	
	following order:	
	"For these reasons, we set aside the Tribunal	
	order, allow the WPST and direct the Tribunal	
	to decide the OA afresh giving the petitioners	
	reasonable opportunity to deal with the	
	supplementary affidavit filed by the	
	respondent. The petitioners are ordered to pay	
	the respondent Rs. 5,000 costs, within a	
	fortnight from the date this order is sent to the	
	server."	
	Obviously, the matter was again appeared before this Court	
	for further fresh hearing on 17.04.2015 when this Tribunal	
	had directed the State respondent to file reply to the

	reply to the supplementary affidavit otherwise appropriate	
	order will be passed on the next date on the basis of the
