	on record that an amount of Rs.19,97,472/- was	
	deposited in the bank account of the applicant on	
	December 30, 2016. No explanation is forthcoming	
	before the Tribunal as to why the final amount of PF was	
	not credited to the bank account of the applicant within a	
	period of 7 (seven) months from the date of issuance of	
	the order by the Principal Accountant General (A & E),	
	West Bengal. Since the formalities of drawing up the bill	
	and disbursement of the actual amount of money in the	
	bank account of the applicant may take for the maximum	
	period of one month and since the amount was actually	
	paid to the applicant after lapse of 7 (seven) months, we	
	are of the view that the applicant is entitled to get	
	interest on the final amount of PF at least from 01.04.2016	
	to 30.12.2016 which is about 6 (six) months. Since this	
	amount of money would have fetched interest @ 6.5%	
	p.a., had this amount been kept in the term deposit in	
	any nationalized bank.	
	In view of our above findings, the Respondent no.	
	3, BDO, Purbasthali – I Development Block, Burdwan is	
	directed to pay to the applicant interest @ 6.5% p.a. on	
	the amount of GPF to the tune of Rs.19,97,472/- for the
