Therefore, the purpose of the compassionate appointment has been frustrated due to the lapse of time. Thus the respondent has rightly rejected the claim of the applicant.</i></p> <p><i>Heard the counsel for the respondent and perused the record and it is found that father of the applicant died on 23.06.1997 and the mother of the applicant made his representation on 08.10.2005 only. Therefore, in our considered opinion, the respondent has rightly rejected the claim of the applicant as the main purpose of compassionate appointment has been frustrated since it is not a matter of right but to meet of the sudden financial crisis arise out of the sudden demise of the bread earner.
