	the applicant was 47 years of age at that point	
	of time and had submitted a representation for	
	consideration for the case of his minor son for	
	compassionate appointment after attaining his	
	majority but he did not make any application in	
	favour of him or stated anything about the	
	financial status of the applicant. Moreover, the	
	instant application has been filed after 10 years	
	after the death of the wife of the applicant. It is
