	The applicants have prayed for direction upon the respondents to	
	consider the applicants for grant of promotion from the post of Chief	
	Discipline Officer and the post of Discipline Officer to the post of Chief	
	Controller (Jailor) / Security Officer, West Bengal Correctional	
	Services.	
	Twenty two (22) applicants joined the post of Disciplined Officers	
	on different dates during the period from 1997 to 2013. Out of twenty	
	two (22) applicants, eight (8) applicants got promotion to the post	
	Chief Discipline Officers during the period from the year 2007 to the	
	year 2017. Out of these eight (8) officers who got promotion to the	
	post of Chief Discipline Officers, two (2) got promotion to the post of	
	Chief Controller (Jailor) and three (3) of them already retired from	
	service. The contention of the applicants is that they were not	
	considered for promotion to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) of	
	Correctional Services in terms of the Recruitment Rules, whereas the	
	Deputy Jailors have already been considered and granted promotion	
	to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) in terms of the said Recruitment	
	Rules. The grievance of the applicants is that they should have been	
	considered for promotion along the Deputy Jailors who have already	
	been granted promotion to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) of	
	Correctional Services.

Mr. Mukherjee, Learned Counsel for the applicants submits that the provisions have been made in the Recruitment Rules for grant of promotion to the post of Jailor from the post of both Deputy Jailor and Chief Discipline Officers and in the absence of suitable candidates in the post of Chief Discipline Officers and Deputy Jailor, the Discipline Officers may also be considered for the said promotion.

The reply of the State respondents indicates that six (6) officers holding the post of Controller of Correctional Services were granted promotion to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) of Correctional Services on the basis of recommendation of Public Service Commission (PSC), West Bengal. The said names were forwarded along with six (06) officers holding the post of Chief Discipline Officer by the Department to PSC on July 25, 2018 for consideration of PSC for the purpose of promotion to the post of Chief Discipline Officers whose names were forwarded to the PSC by the Department, four (4) are the present applicants claiming for promotion to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) of Correctional Services.

None appears on behalf of the State respondents.

There is no dispute that some of the applicants are holding the post of Chief Discipline Officers and the remaining applicants are holding the posts of Discipline Officers of West Bengal Correctional Services. Admittedly, some of the applicants have already retired

from service. The Recruitment Rules for filling up the posts of Jailors	
framed under proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India	
published under Notification No. 1757 H.J dated July 8, 1957 lay	
down as follows :	
"(4) Jailors	
(a) Scale of pay-Rs.150-10-370-15-400 per month (Efficiency bar	
after the 12 th stage.)	
(b) Method of recruitment-(i) 50 per cent by promotion from the posts	
of Deputy Jailors and Chief Discipline Officers. In case the requisite	
quota for promotion is not available from these two cadres, selection	
may be made from Discipline Officers as well; and	
(ii) 50 per cent by direct recruitment on the results of the West Bengal	
Civil Service Examination.	
2. These rules shall come into force with effect from the 15 th day of	
July 1957."	
It appears from the above Recruitment Rules that 50 per cent of	
the posts of Jailors will be filled up by way of direct recruitment on the	
basis of the results of the West Bengal Civil Service Examination and	
the remaining 50 per cent of the posts of Jailors will be filled up by	
way of promotion from the post of Deputy Jailor, Chief Discipline	
Officers and in case the requisite quota for promotion is not available	
from the above two cadres, selection may also be made from	
Discipline Officers. Nothing is on record to indicate that the	
provisions of the above Recruitment Rules have been amended or	
modified by subsequent notification. Accordingly, we find that the

posts of Jailors (Redesignated as Chief Controller of West Bengal Correctional Services) may be filled up by way of promotion from the post of Deputy Jailor and from the post of Chief Discipline Officer to the extent of 50 per cent of the vacancy in the promotional post. The quota for promotion from the cadre of Deputy Jailor and the quota for promotion from the cadre of Chief Discipline Officer has not been mentioned in the Recruitment Rules. On the contrary, the State respondents have disclosed in the reply that the Chief Discipline Officer belongs to the same rank and status as that of Chief Controller of Correctional Services as laid down in Section 10 of West Bengal Correctional Services Act, 1992. However, it has not been clarified by the State respondents whether the pay scale of the Chief Discipline Officers is the same as that of Chief Controller of Correctional Services. Moreover, the documents filed by the State respondents go to establish that the names of six (6) officers holding the post of Controller of Correctional Services and the names of six (6) officers holding the post of Chief Discipline Officers were forwarded to PSC, West Bengal by letter dated July 25, 2018 for consideration of promotion to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) of Correctional Services. While promotion was granted to the officers who were holding the post of Controller of Correctional Services on the basis of recommendation of PSC, West Bengal, no action has yet been taken either by the Department or by PSC, West Bengal with regard to the names of six (6) officers including four applicants holding the post of Chief Discipline Officers and as such promotion was not granted to any of them to the post of Chief Controller of Correctional Services. Since Recruitment Rules of 1957 prescribing

the mode of promotion from the post of Chief Discipline Officer to the post of Jailor is still in existence and since the names of officers from the cadre of Controller of Correctional Services and the officers from the cadre of Chief Discipline Officers were forwarded to PSC, West Bengal, the action should have been taken either for grant of promotion to the post of Chief Discipline Officers or to refuse promotion on the basis of recommendation of PSC, West Bengal. The inaction on the part of the Department of Correctional Administration is unwarranted.

What transpires from the facts of this case is that the the officers holding the post of Chief Discipline Officers are aggrieved for not consideration of their case for grant of promotion to the post of Chief Controller of Correctional Services (Jailor), in spite of existence of the provisions in the Recruitment Rules. The Department of Correctional Administration should evolve norms for fixing the quota of promotion of Deputy Jailors and the quota of promotion of Chief Discipline Officers to the post of Jailor i.e. Chief Controller of Correctional Services. Of course, this guota need to be fixed on consideration of the cadre strength of the Deputy Jailors and the cadre strength of Chief Discipline Officers and this quota must be within the quota of 50 per cent promotion to the post of Chief Controller of Correctional Services. The eligibility criteria for consideration of the Deputy Jailors and the Chief Discipline Officers must also be formulated in order to address the grievances of the officers holding the post of Chief Discipline Officers of West Bengal Correctional Services. The Recruitment Rules published under notification dated July 8, 1957

	In view of our above observation, we direct respondent No. 1,
	Principal Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Department
	of Correctional Administration to expedite the process of
	consideration of the case of six (6) officers holding the post of Chief
	Discipline Officers (including four (4) applicants) whose names were
	forwarded to PSC, West Bengal vide a letter No. 859-DCA/O/6A-
	01/2017 dated July 25, 2018 for grant of promotion to the post of
	Chief Controller of Correctional Services (Jailor) and come to a final
	decision within a period of four months from the date of
	communication of the order. The respondent No. 1 is further directed
	to evolve norms for fixing eligibility criteria and quota for grant of
	promotion from the post of Deputy Jailor and from the post of Chief
	Discipline Officer to the post of Chief Controller (Jailor) of West
	Bengal Correctional Services in consultation with the Finance
	Department, Government of West Bengal and amend the existing
	recruitment rules published under notification dated July 8, 1957, if
	necessary, within a period of six months from the date of
	communication of this order.
