	The instant application has been filed praying a		
	direction upon the respondent to appoint the applicant on		
	compassionate ground after condoning the delay to approach		
	the authority for compassionate appointment. As per the		
	applicant, his mother died on 15.09.1992 while he was only		
	two years old. Subsequently, his father died on 31.08.2001.		
	Thereafter, he applied for compassionate appointment on		
	19.10.2012 as no decision was communicated to him. He		
	approached this Tribunal in OA - 1341 of 2014, which was		
	disposed of on 25.01.2016 with a direction to the		
	respondents to consider the case of the applicant and		
	communication. In pursuance to that order, the respondents		
	have rejected the claim of the applicant vide order dated		
	11.05.2016 hence the application. No reply has been filed.		
	However, the counsel for the respondent has submitted that		
	claim of the applicant was rightly rejected as he was two		
	years of age at the time of death of his mother. Further,		
	father of the applicant was a Central Government employee		
	who died nine years after the death of the mother of the		
	applicant. Therefore, there was no immediate need of		
	financial assistance after the death of the mother of the

	applicant. It has been further submitted that the applicant	3
	made the application for compassionate appointment only in	
	the year 2012 whereas he attained majority in 2008 as his	
	date of birth is 1990. Therefore, the counsel for the	
	respondent has prayed for rejection of the O.A.	
	We have heard the parties and perused the records. It	
	is noted that the claim of applicant was rejected vide order	
	dated 11.05.2016 on the ground of minority as well as delay	
	as the applicant approached the respondents after twenty	
	years from the death of his mother. It is also noted that	
	though respondents have rejected the claim of the applicant	
	already however without challenging the same, he has	
	prayed for direction upon the respondents to appoint him.	
	In view of the above facts and circumstances, we do	
	not find any reason to entertain the instant application as	
	the main purpose of the compassionate appointment has	
	been frustrated due to long lapse of time as the father of the	
	applicant died after nine years from the date of death of his	
	mother and was a Central Government employee.	
	Accordingly, the O.A. is dismissed being devoid of merit.
