	punishment that his previous service would be treated as

	20.06.2003. However, he had filed an appeal before the	
	Deputy Inspector of Police on 11.10.2017 only. In the	
	mean time, he retired on superannuation on 31.03.2016.	
	Therefore, he has challenged the impugned order of	
	disciplinary proceedings in the instant O.A.	
	The counsel for the respondent has raised the	
	preliminary objection that the application is hopelessly	
	barred by limitation as the disciplinary authority has	
	passed his order on 20.06.2003 and there is a clear	
	provision in the statute that the appeal, if any, to be filed	
	within 37 days from the date of receipt of the order.	
	However, the applicant neither filed any appeal within a	
	statutory period of time nor make any objection with	
	regard to lowering down of his pay scale in initial stage	
	but continued his service till his retirement. After	
	superannuation, he had filed one appeal before the	
	authority. However, the applicant has filed the instant	
	application in the year 2018 also. Therefore, he has	
	prayed for dismissal of the O.A.	
	As per the counsel for the applicant since it is a	
	recurring cause of action there is no delay in filing the

	We have heard both the parties and perused the	
	records. It is noted that the applicant was punished by	
	the disciplinary authority with the following punishment.	
	However neither he filed any appeal within the statutory	
	period nor had objected for lowering down of his pay	
	rather he had accepted pay month-wise without any	
	objection during his past service period. Rather has filed	
	the appeal before the Deputy Inspector of Police after his	
	superannuation. It is further observed that the applicant	
	even have not challenged the disciplinary authority's	
	order and has only prayed for a direction to the appellate	
	authority to dispose of his matter. Therefore, since the	
	applicant has already retired from service and has	
	admittedly filed the appeal after his retirement thus cause	
	of action had arisen in the year 2003 and during his	
	service period he had merrily accepted the salary without	
	making any objection to that. In view of the above, we	
	are unable to entertain the O.A. Accordingly, the O.A. is	
	dismissed as per the above observations with no order as	
	to costs.
