	It appears that pursuant to the order dated 28 th				
	November, 2000, the applicant was appointed as a peon on a				
	contract basis for a period of one year in the fixed				
	remuneration of Rs. 2600/- which was terminable on one				
	month's notice on either side. According to the petitioner,				
	the appointment was on compassionate ground and				
	continued without break from 2000 to 2003, like a regular				
	employee, when he was disengaged without notice.				
	Thereafter, the applicant made a representation before the				
	respondent authority on 28th November, 2003 for				
	regularisation of his service as a peon under compassionate				
	appointment which is yet to be considered. Aggrieved this				
	application has been filed.				
	It is noteworthy that the Commanding Officer 3				
	Bengal BN NCC by an intimation dated 28 th November,				
	2003 had requested the Deputy Secretary, Government of				
	West Bengal to put the applicant in a regular establishment				
	in the existing pay & scale of group – D staff as per ROPA				
	1998.

	No. 12655(W) of 2004, in the High Court at Calcutta which	
	was dismissed for want of jurisdiction and liberty was	
	granted to the applicant to take appropriate steps in	
	accordance with law. Thereafter, the instant original	
	application was filed in the year 2018.	
	Since we find that the appointment was made on a	
	contract basis and thereafter, he was disengaged, no order	
	can be passed on this application. However, as the

	dated 28 th November, 2003 to the Deputy Secretary, Govt.	
	of West Bengal, Home (Civil Defence - NCC) Department,
